



Introduction

This document lists restricted cargo types for each PrePass state. When approaching a PrePass facility, you must pull in if your cargo satisfies any of the restricted criteria listed for that state, even if you receive a green light on your transponder.

Please keep this pamphlet in your vehicle as a quick reference. Failure to voluntarily pull in when hauling restricted cargo may result in prosecution, fines, and/or suspension of bypass privileges.

If you do not receive a bypass signal, you must pull into the station.

Special Notes

Colorado

(Dumont WB/EB, Ft. Collins SB, Lamar SB, Limon WB, Monument NB, Trinidad NB)

These ports have exits off the interstate before you reach the port. If you take this exit, you must report to the port when you reenter the interstate, **even if you received a green light on your transponder.**

North Carolina

Enrolled carriers are required to provide PrePass with a photo image that is representative of the tractors (power units) in their fleet. If the image is not in the system, drivers can expect to receive a red light directing them to pull into the weigh station.

West Virginia

An Alliance for Uniform Hazmat Transportation license is required if hauling hazardous materials/waste. Follow in-cab signal. Disregard state signs to pull into weigh station.

Changable Message Signs

PrePass equipped trucks should disregard electronic road signs. Drivers are to follow the signal given by the in-cab device.

Bypass Restrictions by State

If a driver receives a green light, and any of the following conditions apply, the driver must pull into the inspection facility.

Alabama

Oversize/Overweight (even permitted loads)

Agricultural loads

Bulk fuel loads

Livestock loads

Arizona

Oversize/Overweight (unless Class E permit)

Fuel import loads

Placarded Hazmat and Hazwaste loads

Arkansas

Oversize/Overweight (even permitted loads)

Placarded Hazmat and Hazwaste loads

California

Oversize/Overweight (even permitted loads)

Agricultural loads – only pull in if directed by enforcement facility signs

Vehicles using multiple bypass systems: If you receive a red light for either system, you are not permitted to bypass.

Colorado

Oversize/Overweight (even permitted loads) **except LCVs operating with an annual permit and receive a green light**

Temporary permit to haul hazardous waste/materials

Oversize/Overweight (even permitted loads)

Florida Agricultural Inspection Facilities

Overwidth at 10 feet or less

Overheight at 15 feet 6 inches or less

Overlength with a term 95 feet doubles permit
